


## ABOUT PROJECT AWARE

The Project AWARE grant, provided through Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), aims to increase awareness of behavioral and mental health issues among school-aged youth by promoting awareness among students, training school staff, and providing families with community resources. This report summarizes accomplishments for Quarter 2 (October 1<sup>st</sup> – December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022) of Year 4.




A total of 149 students were referred for mental health services in Quarter 2. As of January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023, 71% of those students have received services thus far, with 67% of those who have not yet received services currently working with School Counselors and the Mental Health Navigator to receive services in the future.

Of those referrals, 61% were to school-based services, 23% to social/emotional counseling group, 8% to community-based services, and 8% to co-facilitated small groups.



\*Of the 43 students who did not yet receive services:

- 29 families are working with school counselors and the Mental Health Navigator to receive services
- 13 families declined services
- 1 student moved out of the district
